English	Mathematics
During Summer 1, Year 4 children will firstly focus on contemporary poetry. Children will have opportunities to memorise high-quality, famous poems, write their own versions and perform exciting pieces of poetry. Art & Design	Computing
This half term Year 4 will focus on graphic design. Pupils will develop their understanding of the role of a graphic designer, explore a range of digital icons and practice using computer programs to design their own digital icons.	Year 4's Computing lessons this half term will offer an additional opportunity for pupils to explore graphic design. To develop their learning from Art & Design lessons, pupils will practice using a range of functions such as masking to create a range of digital icons.
Design & Technology	Geography
This term Year 4's Design and Technology lessons focus on structures. We will explore a range of free-standing structures and select appropriate materials to create our own structures. Pupils will utilise this knowledge to design and create their own stable, free-standing pavilions.	Year 4 will develop their map reading and orientating skills next half term. We will use maps to locate Plessey Woods, identify human and physical features of the woods using keys on maps and plan the orienteering route we will take around Plessey Woods.
History	Music
After learning about the Saxons and Vikings, our Year 4 historical study culminates in learning about the Battle of Hastings. Children will study timelines, evaluate sources and present their own understanding of both the build up to the battle and the consequences for the country after.	This term Year 4 will be taking part in recorder lessons! We are looking forward to developing our knowledge of notation and key music terminology. We will develop our confidence, accuracy and control whilst playing the recorder.
Personal Social Health & Economics Education (PSHE)	Physical Education (PE)

We will pay particular attention to exploring our career aspirations and what may influence our career choices.
