



Medium Term Planning

Year 5

Summer 2025 Second Half Term



English	Mathematics
We will study the Highway Man reproducing our own Tale of Fear. They will then wear their journalistic hats and complete an engaging and exciting newspaper article, demonstrating the complex and eye catching features. Year 5 will continue to learn and apply a range of grammar, punctuation and spellings.	Year 5 will continue to build on their arithmetic skills, with daily practice, showcasing their learning from across the year. This half term, they will focus on geometry. This will include the properties, position and direction of shape. They will develop their measurement skills by converting between units, both metric and imperial. They will also learn about volume.
Art & Design	Computing
This half term, Year 5 pupils will focus on digital art: graphic design. They will use a range of tools in different presentation software to design an app about our school.	Pupils in Year 5 will be introduced to text-based programming, exploring some the advancements and complexities of coding.
Design & Technology	Geography
This half term we will be designing and creating complex 3D structures. This involves working in groups to design and build bridges and apply knowledge of strengthening techniques. This will be followed up by detailed evaluations.	Pupils will describe and understand the physical geography of climate zones. They will identify the position and significance of the Equator, Northern and Southern Hemispheres. They will learn about temperatures and climates, focusing on The Tropics, Arctic and Antarctic circle.
History	Music
This half term, Year 5 will be learning all about the warrior Boudica and how she led an army against the Romans. We will explore the Roman invasion, focusing on the battles and bravery of Celts and British inhabitants to stop the Romans. We will research the impact the Romans had in our locality.	Year 5 will be learning to sing and perform 'Dancing in the Street'. They will use notation, body percussion and playing notes on instruments to improvise an instrumental section within the song. They will also consolidate singing, performing and playing an instrument to Living on a Prayer.
Personal Social Health Economics (PSHE)	Physical Education (PE)
Year 5 pupils will learn about the topic 'changing body'. This will allow the class to explore and learn about the emotional and physical changes of puberty, which will include understanding the menstrual cycle.	Pupils will enjoy participating in a range of athletics skills and games which will be demonstrated on sports day. They will understand the importance of warming up and cooling down. They will develop a range of running, jumping and throwing techniques. Year 5 will be able to evaluate and analyse their performance.
Religious Education (RE)	Science
Pupils will learn about why some places in the world are significant to religious followers. Pupils will investigate each location, discussing what led these places to become important, how they affected culture and why there might have been conflict.	Pupils will strengthen and enhance the science skills they've learned throughout the year, posing as scientists and leading the investigation: Does the size of an asteroid affect the diameter of its impact crater?
In KS2 we learn French in our Modern Foreign Languages Curriculum (MFL)	
Year 5 will learn about the topic: The Weekend (Le weekend). They will learn how to tell the time and accurately say what they get up to at the weekend, sharing this through oral and written presentation.
