

North Tyneside Councils Go Smarter team have visited your childs School today. We would like to ask for your help in keeping children safer near the roads. Talk to your children about the following to help them understand the dangers around the roads.

- On the pavement When walking near a road hold your child's hand - don't let them run ahead.
- Set a good example by using the Green Cross Code
  explain to your child to STOP at the kerb, then LOOK both
  ways and LISTEN for traffic before crossing, when it's safe
  to cross, walk straight across the road and keep looking
  and listening. THINK have you chosen the safest place to
  cross, look for Pedestrian Crossing, Zebra Crossings and
  School Crossing Patrols etc.
- Be Bright, Be Seen It is important that other road users can see you and your children easily. Explain to your child how wearing brighter materials helps drivers to see you from further away.
