<p><b>Focus: New term computing curriculum – Online safety lessons</b></p> <p>Each year group spends the Autumn term learning about basic online safety and how to stay safe in a digital world. They recap and develop their understanding incrementally.</p> <p>The core message aligns with SMART principles:  <b>S</b>afe – keep personal details away from strangers.  <b>M</b>eat: Don't meet people that you only know online.  <b>A</b>ccept – don't open or accept any emails or links that you are unsure about.  <b>R</b>eliable – information may not be real, only use trusted websites.  <b>T</b>ell – always tell a trusted adult.</p>		<p><b>Focus: Safer Internet Day</b></p> <p>Safer Internet Day allows pupils to partake in a national celebration of the online world and how to keep safe.</p> <p>BBC release a live lesson which teaches about the online safety focus for that year.</p>		<p><b>Focus: Parents surgery / Bank of online safety posters held on our website</b></p> <p>Online Safety support will be provided for parents and carers through a range of initiatives.</p> <p>These may include a parental session with the police.</p> <p>A surgery with the computing and online safety lead and the local authority consultant.</p> <p>Informative posters will be released on the school website each week, detailing information about a range of digital issues and how to effectively understand, manage and support them.</p>
