

How we embed British Values into our History Curriculum

Democracy

Pupils learn about democracy by exploring how decisions were made in the past: such as in Ancient Greece, and comparing this to how decisions are made today, alongside opportunities to debate and vote on historical interpretations.

Individual Liberty

Individual liberty is explored through the lives of significant individuals who stood up for rights and freedoms such as: Florence Nightingale, Mary Seacole and Edith Cavell. Our pupils begin to understand the impact of personal choices.

Mutual Respect & Tolerance

Mutual respect and tolerance is developed by studying diverse societies and cultures across different periods, helping our children to challenge stereotypes and appreciate difference.

Rule of Law

The rule of law is taught through examining historical events where laws shaped society. For example, in Year 6 they study a unit of work about Social History (Crime and Punishment) helping pupils understand the importance of fairness and justice over time.
