



How we embed British Values into our PSHE & RSE Curriculum

Democracy

Democracy is embedded throughout our PSHE and RSE curriculum by encouraging pupils to express their views, listen to others, and participate in decision-making opportunities within our classrooms and our wider school community. Through class discussions, circle time, pupil voice activities, and collaborative learning, children learn that everyone's opinions matter and that decisions can be made fairly. Pupils are taught how to respectfully debate issues, vote on class matters, and understand the importance of fairness and representation.

Individual Liberty

We promote individual liberty at our school, by supporting pupils to develop self-confidence, independence, and resilience. Within PSHE and RSE lessons, children are encouraged to make informed choices, express their opinions respectfully, and understand their rights and responsibilities. Pupils learn how to keep themselves safe, both online and offline, and are empowered to make positive decisions about managing money, friendships, wellbeing, and healthy lifestyles.

Mutual Respect & Tolerance

Our pupils are taught to value and respect the thoughts, feelings, and beliefs of others, even when opinions may differ from their own. Through collaborative activities, discussions, and relationship education, children develop empathy, kindness, and positive communication skills. Our PSHE and RSE curriculum promotes understanding and appreciation of the diverse cultures, faiths, and beliefs represented in modern Britain. Pupils are encouraged to explore and celebrate differences while recognising shared values and experiences. We actively challenge stereotypes and discrimination, helping pupils to become compassionate, open-minded, and responsible citizens.

Rule of Law

Our PSHE and RSE curriculum helps pupils understand the importance of rules, responsibilities, and consequences both within school and in the wider community. Children explore why laws and rules are necessary to keep people safe, happy, and secure. Through discussions around behaviour, rights, safety, and personal responsibility, pupils develop an understanding of how laws protect individuals and communities.
