Democracy

Children are given regular opportunities to share their thoughts, ideas, and opinions through discussions, group activities, and interactions with others. They are encouraged to listen carefully, take turns, and understand that everyone's voice is important, supporting their understanding of fairness and participation.

Individual Liberty

We support children to express themselves confidently and independently through spoken language. They are encouraged to initiate conversations, make choices about what they want to communicate, and share their own experiences, promoting confidence and self-expression.

Mutual Respect & Tolerance

Children learn to listen attentively and respond appropriately to others. Through discussion and interaction, they begin to recognise and respect differences in opinions, experiences, and backgrounds, developing an understanding of diversity.

Rule of Law

Clear expectations for communication are embedded, such as taking turns, listening to others, and using kind and respectful language. Children learn that these rules support positive interactions and help create a safe environment for everyone.
